Thank you for your e-mail of 1 May 2020 asking for information about the deployment of RAF Tornado aircraft over Nigeria in 2014. Specifically you requested the following information:

"Can you please advise the number of RAF Tornado's deployed to Nigeria in 2014, the nature of the mission and operational tasks they were assigned.

Also please confirm the number of sorties undertaken by the detachment, whether they received tanker support from non UK assets and number of weapons, if any, released."

Firstly, please accept my apologies for the delay in responding to you which was caused by the effect on resources and necessary changes to ways of working resulting from the Corona virus.

I am treating your correspondence as requests for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). We have now completed a search of our paper and electronic records for the information you requested, and I can confirm that information within the scope of your request is held.

From late August to mid October 2014 as part of the international effort to locate and retrieve the abducted Chibok schoolgirls in North East Nigeria, three RAF Tornado GR4 aircraft were deployed to Chad. Our records indicate that during the course of the deployment 56 Tornado sorties were undertaken including transit from the UK. The aircraft were unarmed and were tasked with locating the missing schoolgirls. They did not receive air to air refuelling tanker support from other nations.
