<p>1. Contact the district office where you will register your marriage to find out what documentation is required.</p> <p>It is your responsibility to find out what documents you need from the district office before your appointment at the embassy.</p>	
<p>2. Apply for an Affirmation Online https://www.prove-eligibility-foreign-government.service.gov.uk/thailand/uk-passport</p>	
<p>3. Apply for an Affirmation with a paper form</p> <p>i. Book an appointment online: https://www.consular-appointments.service.gov.uk/fco/#!/british-embassy-bangkok/oaths-affirmations-and-affidavits/slot_picker Your appointment is a reservation. Do not make any travel arrangements until you receive a confirmation email from us.</p> <p>ii. Pay for your requested service(s) online. You will receive a receipt via email. Bring a copy of your receipt to your appointment. If you require an affirmation of marital status <i>and</i> a certified copy of your passport, you will need to make separate payments Pay for an affirmation: https://www.gov.uk/payments/bangkok-embassy-foreign-and-commonwealth-office/fee-4-affirmation Pay for a certified copy of your British passport: https://www.gov.uk/payments/bangkok-embassy-foreign-and-commonwealth-office/fee-6-certified-copy</p> <p>iii. Send a Microsoft Word version of your typed affirmation to Bangkok.DocumentaryServices@fcdo.gov.uk along with the supporting documents listed below to be checked by Consular staff. We will email a copy of your affirmation to you with details of any amendments that you need to make. Your reservation will also become a confirmed appointment. You will need to bring this affirmation to your appointment. The email must be less than 5MB. You will receive an auto-reply to confirm we have received your documents.</p> <p>If you do not email us a copy of your affirmation, your appointment will not be confirmed and we will be unable to provide you with an affirmation of marital status.</p>

<p>i. British Passport</p> <p>ii. Typed affirmation (do not sign until instructed to do so by consular officer)</p> <p>a. Once you have submitted your affirmation and supporting documents either online or via email, your affirmation will be checked by Consular staff. You will receive a copy of your affirmation via email within 5 working days</p> <p>iii. Completed Consular service request form below</p> <p>iv. Proof of online payment (print from your email)</p> <p>v. Copy of partner's ID card or passport</p> <p>vi. Original decree absolute or PDF and covering letter from court</p> <p>vii. Yellow book or pink ID card if you wish to use your Thai address as your usual address</p>	

5. AFTER YOUR APPOINTMENT – YOUR DOCUMENTS ARE VALID FOR 3 MONTHS	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>
<p>i. Get your documents translated into Thai Go to any translation agency. There are translation services available at the Legalisation Division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</p>	
<p>ii. Get your documents legalised:</p> <p> Legalization Division, 3rd floor OR Legalization Division Department of Consular Affairs Khlong Toei Blue Line MRT station (the office is Ministry of Foreign Affairs located inside the MRT station and is clearly 123 Chaeng Watthana Road signposted when you arrive) Bangkok 10210 </p>	
<p>iii. Attend the district office (known as an amphur, amphoe or khet in English, or อำเภอ/เขต in Thai) to register your marriage. A religious ceremony isn't valid on its own – a registrar must marry you.</p>
