
This iteration 2 product builds on marine planning work throughout 2017 including;

#### About the north west plan areas

The north west marine plan areas includes the inshore and offshore areas. They cover approximately 1,280 kilometres of coastline, stretching from the Scottish border to the River Dee border with Wales.

They include the marine area from mean high water spring tides out to the seaward limit of the Exclusive Economic Zone, approximately 7,100 square kilometres of sea. They borders Scotland, Wales and the Isle of Man.

The north west plans area is important for energy production both through discrete gas reserves and renewable energy. It is also home to Heysham I and 2 nuclear sites. The north west marine plan areas hosts eight special protection areas, including one of two SPAs which are entirely marine, seven special areas of conservation and nine UNESCO world heritage sites.
























### Marine Information System (MIS)


#### Objectives

- Achieving a sustainable marine economy
- Ensuring a strong, healthy and just society
- Living within environmental limits
- Promoting good governance
- Using sound science responsibly

These objectives will be delivered in the north west marine plan areas through a variety of means, but principally by addressing the issues through marine plan policies.

Our experience and discussion with stakeholders have shown that these objectives will appropriately address the issues of the north west marine plan areas.






#### Stakeholder engagement
