# INTRODUCTION

The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care has announced a scheme of payments for people on low incomes in areas with a high incidence of Coronavirus, who need to self-isolate and are unable to work from home. Applications, payments and disputes are the responsibility of Local Authorities. The scheme started on 1.9.20.

# **ELIGIBILITY**

- 2 Eligibility is restricted to people who are resident in Blackburn with Darwen, Oldham or Pendle and who meet the following criteria:
  - 1. They have received notification from NHS Test and Trace;
  - 2. They have agreed to comply with the notification from NHS Test and Trace and provided contact details to their LA;
  - **3.** They are employed or self-employed;
  - **4.** They are unable to work from home and will lose income as a result.
  - **5.** They are currently receiving UC, WTC, income-related ESA, income-based JSA, IS or SPC or HB.

Virus infection rates are monitored and the scope of the scheme may be subject to change in the future.



# THE TREATMENT OF PAYMENTS FOR UC PURPOSES

3 Payments under this scheme are not included in unearned income to be taken into account<sup>1</sup> and therefore do not affect UC.
