TDU - Negligible impact on TDU as this will be incorporated in the normal development activity however Supplier 3's query is a valid point. While this data should only be returned for newly qualified teachers it is apparent that this is being reported again each year for some teachers.

To mitigate thousands of errors in the 2019 SWF we propose to delay removal of the code until 2020 and consider adding a QTS date to ensure only pulled through for newly qualified
