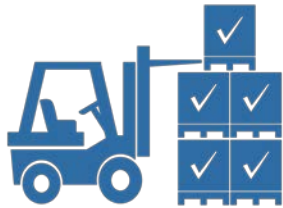


National Clearance Hub (HMRC) uses Import Entry Paperwork to inform Suffolk Trading Standards of details of the importer, storage address, the net weight of the fireworks, how many shipping containers (if applicable), and how many cartons of fireworks, as well as the date the goods arrived into the UK.

This information is then recorded by Suffolk Trading Standards, who maintain a central database of all the importations, and then this information is passed on to the relevant licencing authorities and HSE via email.

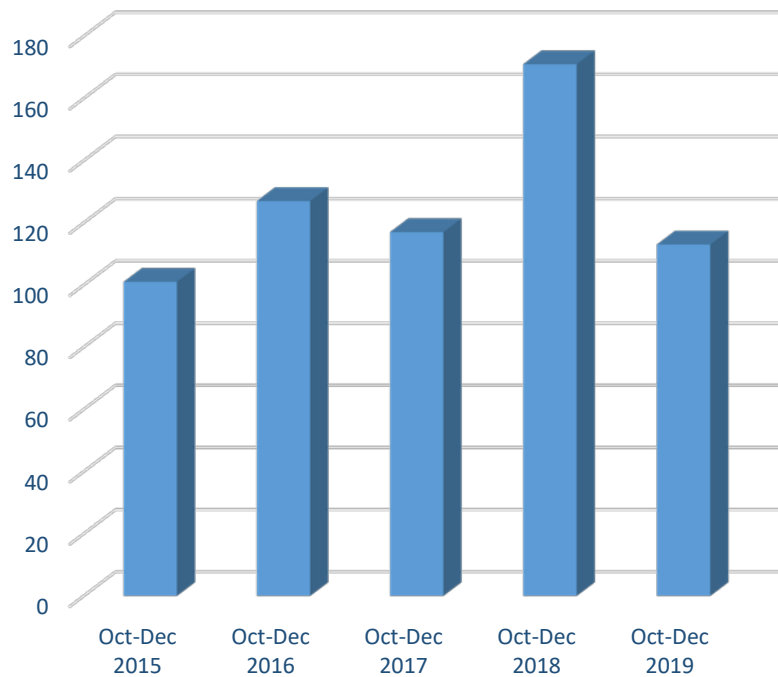

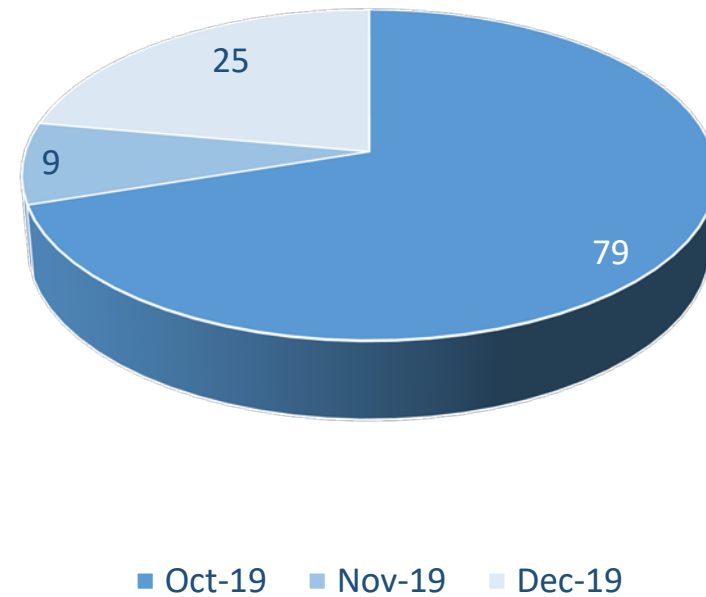

Total Consignments by Month



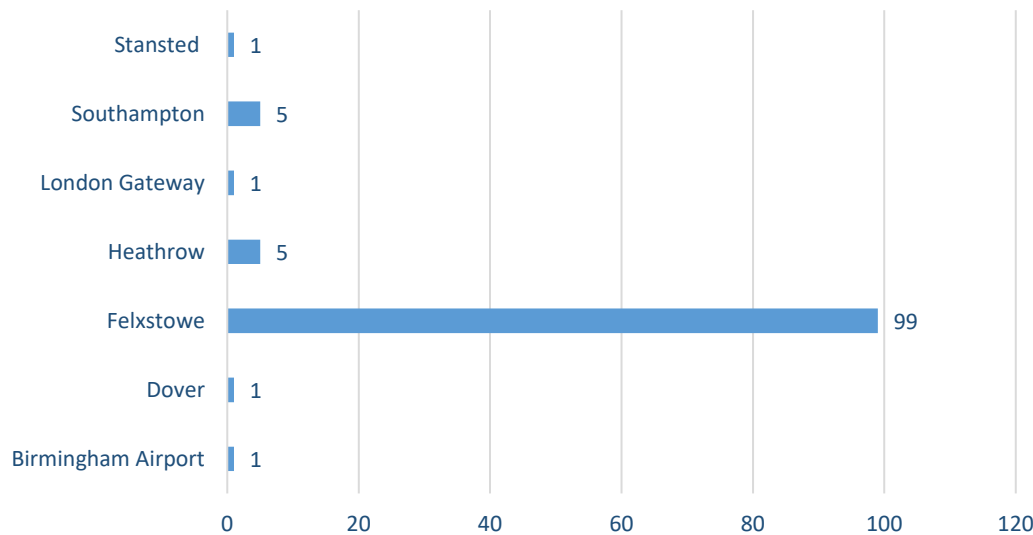

**Quarter 3 Evaluation 2019-20**

Quarter 3 2019-20 saw a decrease in the number of consignments compared to the same period last year. The month of October generally sees a high volume of consignments, carrying on from September which is generally the busiest month of the year and this year was no exception with 70% of consignments arriving in October for Quarter 3.

**Places of Entry into UK (October - December 2019)**
