Running away rta type injuries

Trauma from galloping through fence

RTA due to running off when startled

Likely psychological/emotional injury possibly leading to shortened lifespan/reduced quality of life (euthanasia if unmanageable behaviour, injury/death bolting in fright into traffic etc, spiralling behavioural anxiety issues initially triggered by fireworks noise phobias)

Colic from stress of fireworks

Horses running through fences etc to escape noise of fireworks

Flight injuries

Trauma due to galloping in the field when startled by fireworks

One dog escaped, ran off and was killed by a passing car

One dog tried to escape from a kennel and pulled all of his front teeth (including canines) out
