Annex 1: Sub-samples within the rough sleeping sample

The report primarily focused on respondents who had slept rough in the last year (n=563). However, due to modifications to the questionnaire, or timing of analysis, in places analysis has been presented only on a subset of respondents within the 563 respondents.

Subsample A: Respondents who formed the base for the Unit Cost Analysis (Chapter 4: Annual fiscal cost of individuals who sleep rough)

The analysis focused only on respondents who participated in 2019 and were UK nationals who had slept rough in the last year (n=395).

Subsample B: Respondents who were asked about their physical health needs

Detailed questions on the topic of physical health were added into the questionnaire part way through 2019 fieldwork. As such, only a subset of respondents were asked about their physical health (n=350). And within this, only 257 were asked about all physical health conditions.

Subsample C: Respondents who were asked about domestic abuse consistently

The question about domestic abuse was improved partway through the 2019 fieldwork. As such, only a subset of respondents can be included in the analysis on domestic abuse (n=264). This sample is used to estimate the number of support needs and vulnerabilities respondents have in section 3.6 Holistic Picture – Overlapping Vulnerabilities and Experiences.

Subsample D: Respondents who slept rough within the last three months

The way the questionnaire was structured meant that not all respondents were asked the same questions. Only respondents who reported having slept rough within the last three months were asked how many nights they'd slept rough in the last three months and to approximate the amount of time spent sleeping rough over the last year. As such, this sub-sample forms Subsample D.

Subsample E: UK-nationals only and Subsample F: Non-UK nationals only

In Chapter 3.8.1 Employment, experience and skills, the prevalence of employment within UK nationals and non UK nationals were compared.

Annex 2: Methodology for fiscal unit costs

Introduction

The data set includes UK nationals who have slept rough within the last year. The RSEQ data records which services individuals have used and the number of times individuals have accessed services. All questions except drug or alcohol dependency treatment questions measure experiences in the last 3 months. Participants are more likely to answer accurately when providing information in the last quarter, compared to the last year and as such using this data and extrapolating to a year was deemed more robust.

Unit cost per year calculation

Health Services (e.g. GP visits, A&E visits, hospital appointments & hospital stays)

The total number of individuals who have used a service is multiplied by the mean number of service usage and the unit cost. This is then converted into an annual cost. This figure is then divided by the total number of participants using the service (excluding those with missing data for the relevant question) to give an annual cost per individual who sleeps rough.

Example Calculation: GP visits

The unit cost was derived from the Unit Cost Database 'GP - cost per hour, General Medical Services activity'¹. It was then adjusted to take account of the average length of a GP appointment (15 minutes). The average cost calculation was as follows:

Average cost of GP visits =

Substance treatments (drug and alcohol)

The methodology is as mentioned above with health services; however, data is derived from treatment within the last year.

Criminal Justice Services

Data for the number of arrests, convictions and time spent in prison was collected using ranges. The midpoint in these ranges was multiplied by the total number of arrests etc.

Rough Sleeping Services

To derive the cost of rough sleeping services, we estimate the average number of nights slept rough over the last three months, extrapolate this, and combine this with an uprated average daily cost incurred by local authorities from Lankelly Chase.

Unit costs

This section provides a detailed breakdown of the individual unit costs used to calculate the cost per average rough sleeper per year.

Data manipulation

To determine the unit costs of some services, additional data manipulation was required. This is summarised below, and relates to the sources listed above.

GP services

For this analysis, an assumption of 15 minutes per GP appointment was made. The unit cost was multiplied by the average number of GP appointments reported per respondent. A general public estimate is also included for reference.³

Alcohol and drug treatment services

The questionnaire asked whether respondents had accessed drug or alcohol treatment services within the last year. In the absence of a data on the frequency of service use in the questionnaire, it has been estimated that if a respondent had reported treatment in the last year, it was on one occasion. The unit cost for treatment was then multiplied by the number of respondents who had reported service use. A general public estimate is also included for reference.⁴

Mental and physical health services

Mental and physical health service unit costs consist of costs from hospital appointments and stays, which were calculated separately and summed together.

Costs associated with staying in hospital as a result of a mental health issue used two units: a \pounds 19 per bed per day and \pounds 319 per initial mental health assessment. For respondents who had been an inpatient in hospital for a mental health need, the mean number of days spent in hospital was 16 days, which was multiplied by the number of respondents who had reported a stay for a mental health issue and the unit cost. This was assumed to give the total cost for three months.

Arrests and Convictions

Respondents were asked to provide the number of times they had been arrested and/or convicted in the last year either by providing the raw figure in an open text box or selecting from a range provided in the questionnaire. For each range, the midpoint is used as the assumed number of arrests/convictions, or where the option is a number and above, the minimum is used. Multiplying the assumed number by the frequency of individuals who were in that category and adding them altogether, gives an estimate for the total number of arrests/convictions in the last three months. The number of respondents who reported an arrest and/or convicted was multiplied by the unit cost to give a yearly cost.

Questions on the number of convictions and/or arrested were only asked in a subsample of respondents due to changes in the questionnaire therefore the sample size for this analysis is smaller than others.

Prison

All respondents were asked to report whether they had ever been to prison. Anyone who had been to prison within the last year, was asked about the number of separate times and the total length of time spent in prison over the last year.

Similar to arrests and convictions, ranges were provided for the length of stay in prison. The midpoint was used for each range, excluding the 'a week or less' option where a week was assumed and 'more than 9 months' where a year was assumed. The aggregate number of weeks in prison was calculated and the annual cost of prison from the UCD was converted to a weekly cost. The annual cost is then determined by multiplying the two together.

Rough sleeping services

The unit cost provided by the source was from 2013. This cost was uprated to 2019/20 prices. Respondents were asked to select from ranges provided the length of time they had spent sleeping rough over the last three months. The midpoint was used for each range in the analysis, excluding the response option of 'more than 30 days' where 30 days was assumed (a lower bound estimate). The mean time spent sleeping rough was applied to the individuals who responded, 'don't know'. This was multiplied by the unit cost to get an annual figure. This was then divided by the number of individuals who had slept rough for less than 1 year.

Annex 3: Statistical Analysis

A Fisher's Exact Test was conducted to assess statistical significance for correlations. This test of significance was chosen as every variable contained non-response answers which had less than 5 counts. As detailed in the methodology section, a non-response answer was either a respondent selecting "don't know" or "don't want to say", or missing the question entirely. This was analysed separately, but each option were grouped and reported as a 'non-response' in the main findings.
