2. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Do I need to send you a copy of my green residence certificate and my certificado de empadronamiento?						
A. You only need to send us a copy of your certificado de empadronamiento if you no longer reside at the address mentioned in your green residence certificate/TIE photo card.						
Q. If my marriage certificate has not been issued and/or legalised within the last 3 months will it be accepted by the Spanish authorities?						
A. The Spanish Foreigners' Office (Extranjería) will usually require your marriage certificate to have been both issued and legalised in the last 3 months prior to the date of your appointment to submit your residence card application. It is a Spanish requirement therefore you need to check with your local Spanish Foreigners' Office as to whether they will accept a marriage certificate issued more than 3 months and/or legalised more than 3 months beforehand and let us know. You must do this before applying for your consular certificate. We will then send you a disclaimer to sign and send back to us regarding the non refund of consular fees when we receive your application.						
Q. Where can I get a translation into Spanish of my marriage certificate?						
A. We understand the Foreigners Office will accept a translation into Spanish if it has been done by a sworn translator - see the <u>list of translators and interpreters</u> , or, the consulate or embassy in Spain of the country where the marriage took place.						
Q. Where do I get my marriage certificate legalised?						
A. If the country where you married is part of the Hague Convention, the legalisation office in that country will place a stamp or vignette called "The Hague Apostille" (Apostilla de la Haya) on the back of the document.						
Check the list of countries that are part of the Hague Convention						
If not, you'll need to use the diplomatic legalisation process and you need to contact the authorities in the country you got married or the embassy or consulate of the country where you got married in Spain.						

3. CHECKLIST FOR SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

You MUST send us copies of the following supporting documents and take the originals with you to the British consulate on the day of your appointment

3	PROOF OF RESIDENCY • Your Spanish residence certificate (green document/card or TIE photo card), bearing your current address.	
4	PROOF OF CURRENT ADDRESS • Your "Certificado de Empadronamiento" (town hall registration certificate), bearing your current address. See Frequently Asked Question no. 1 on page 6 if your current address is not the same as the one mentioned on your residence certificate/ TIE card.	
5	YOUR SPOUSE'S PASSPORT • A photocopy of your spouse's valid passport	
6	ORIGINAL MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE • Your original marriage certificate issued AND legalised in the country of issue in the last 3 months (contact the Embassy/consulate in Spain of the country where the marriage took place for advice)	
7	OFFICIAL TRANSLATION OF MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE An official translation into Spanish of your legalised marriage certificate (see information about official translations on our website)	

PLEASE NOTE: If any of your documents are not issued in the UK or Spain, we may need to make further enquiries. You will have to arrange a translation of any documents that are not in English or Spanish. We accept translations into either English or Spanish but please note that the Spanish authorities may ask you to provide a Spanish translation of any document not in Spanish.

It is important that your email attachments **are no larger than 4MB** in total, or your email will not get through to us. If your attachments are larger than this, you can send multiple emails to cover all of the documents we are requesting. You will receive an automated response to your email. You will only receive one automated response per day.

We will contact you if we have any queries about your documents.

✓ MAKE ONLINE PAYMENT ONCE APPLICATION IS APPROVED

On receipt of a fully completed application with copies of supporting documents by email, we will send you a link by email inviting you to pay on-line via gov.uk payments. All fees are payable in pounds sterling.

The consular fees are as follows:

✓ BOOK YOUR APPOINTMENT

On receipt of payment we will contact you and your spouse with booking details to make an appointment at your <u>nearest British consulate</u> in Spain.

On the day of your appointment at the British consulate you must take with you the original copies and documents mentioned in the Checklist.
