

Green growth opportunities for women and youth in urban areas of Mozambique

Summary of discussion: 11 February 2021

1. Introduction

This note complements the WOW Helpdesk query on potential economic opportunities for urban women and youth in the green-growth and low-carbon sectors of the economy in Mozambique. A 1.5-hour consultation took place on 11th February 2021 with key members of the FCDO/MUVA team to identify next steps.

The results of the helpdesk query on the global evidence, sectors and examples were presented. The WOW consultancy team had identified a range of potential strategic choices for MUVA to discuss as part of developing options — choosing a sector; greening existing work; partnering with organisations already working in green sectors; a focus on skills for green sectors. However, early in the discussion it became clear that the scope of the desk review did not include all the questions MUVA needs answers to before getting into discussions and decisions on options.

The team shifted its focus to a discussion on what are the key questions MUVA needs to consider in further research which will focus on the Mozambique context. This included further research into periurban and coastal areas. It was agreed that a deliverable from the meeting would be a short note describing a set of principles for MUVA's engagement in green sectors and a matrix to help identify sectors that could be included in the other consultancy.

2. Principles for MUVA's engagement in green sectors

MUVA's engagement in the green economy should be guided by the following principles in addition to MUVA's mission to: test new approaches; bring innovative approaches to Mozambique; work in urban or peri-urban areas; identify ideas with potential for scale and sustainability; co-creation and partnership with local actors; realistic and practical timeframe and resources. (Sentences in italics are additional to what was discussed but may be useful for MUVA to consider):

- **Putting women and youth at the centre**: making sure women / youth benefit from opportunities in green sectors. *This could also include intersectionality, do no harm, & participation.*
- Solving a problem: addressing issues people are grappling with in terms of women and youth's
 engagement in green sectors. Using a flexible and adaptive approach, generating evidence and
 managing risk.



Disrupting social norms: creating opportunities in traditionally male-dominated occupations and addressing constraints and opportunities for women and youth's economic empowerment.
