SUPPORT FOR FISHING RELATED ACTIVITIES

1. Introduction

Funding in this area will support a sustainable sector through limiting the environmental impact of fishing and increasing the value and the quality of catch.

Funding can be applied for under the following measures:

M1 Limiting the environmental impact of fishing M16 Improving the value and quality of fisheries products M29 Supporting innovation in the seafood sector

Details of eligible projects and monitoring requirements for each measure can be found in Section 2, Projects you can apply for.

Please note this information is for guidance only and is not exhaustive or binding. If you are unsure whether an item is eligible, please check the General Guidance and if you are still unsure contact the MMO.

Support shall not be granted more than once during the programming period for the same type of equipment on the same English registered fishing vessel.

When applying for funding onboard vessels you must engage with the Maritime & Coastguard Agency (MCA). Details of local surveyors and offices can be found in the following link https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/maritime-and-coastguard-agency

MCA must be included in the process as work is undertaken, particularly where there may be an impact on stability.

The Grants team will send details of submitted applications to MCA as soon as they are received for review. MMO Grants Team will also contact MCA at the claims stage to ensure that the applicant has made MCA aware of all the work that has been undertaken and no funds will be paid out unless this confirmation has been received.

All work undertaken by the owner/skipper of the vessel must meet MCA safety/ stability requirements, whether funded by FaSS or otherwise. Responsibility for any work undertaken which renders a vessel unstable or unsafe remains entirely with the owner/skipper of the vessel.

2. Projects you can apply for

M1 Limiting the environmental impact of fishing

Projects can include:

- Equipment that improves the size or species selectivity of gear;
- Equipment that eliminates discards by avoiding and reducing unwanted catches of commercial stocks, or that deals with unwanted catches to be landed:
- Equipment that limits and, where possible, eliminates the physical and biological impacts of fishing on the ecosystem or the seabed;
- Equipment that protects gear and catches from mammals and birds provided that
 it does not undermine the selectivity of the fishing gear and that all appropriate
 measures are introduced to avoid physical damage to the predators;
- We will only fund vessels switching to a different fishery if we are satisfied that this
 would not be to the detriment of new stock(s) and ecosystem.

Support shall only be granted where the gear or other equipment has a demonstrably better size-selection or a demonstrably lower impact on the ecosystem and on non-target species than the standard gear or other equipment permitted under law, or under relevant national law. For example, a different net size or a new net with an escape hatch for juvenile fish. You must tell us in your application how your gear or other equipment is demonstrably better than your previous gear or equipment.

Support will only be given for one gear replacement project to the same applicant on the same vessel during the FaSS scheme.

FaSS cannot contribute to an increase in fishing effort. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the beneficiary to ensure that the gear that is being replaced is destroyed accordingly. This will need to be verified by the relevant MMO Coastal Office at the claims inspection stage and claims will not be paid unless the relevant evidence has been provided.

Projects excluded from funding

Funding will not be provided for:

- Gear that is shown to be equally or less selective than the gear already being used;
- Projects that cannot adequately evidence the disposal of the gear that is being replaced.

M16 Improving the value and quality of fisheries products

Projects can include:

- Investments that add value to fishery products;
- Innovative investments on board that improve the quality of fishery products conditional on the use of selective gear that minimise unwanted catches;
- Investments that increase the quality, control and traceability of the products landed;
- We can fund improvements to fish holds including lining and refrigeration where there is no increase in their capacity.

Projects excluded from funding

Funding will not be provided for:

- Investments not on-board vessels; these might be eligible under the category of Shore-Based Facilities.
- Projects that are unable to clearly demonstrate the improved quality or value added to fisheries products.
- Projects that seek to increase the capacity of fish holds.

Projects can include:

 New or improved management and organisation systems to adapt to new ways of working and new/changing markets.

Projects above must be carried out by, or in collaboration with, a scientific or technical body, recognised by the MMO. The scientific or technical body must validate the results of your project.

Projects excluded from funding

Funding will not be provided for:

 Any projects not carried out by, or in collaboration with a scientific or technical body recognised by the MMO, or where the results of the project will not be validated by the recognised scientific or technical body.
