# People being kept in long term segregation



This is an Easy Read version of a letter from the **Minister of State for Care** to **Baroness Hollins**.



The **Minister of State for Care** is called Helen Whately. She helps to run the government's Department for Health and Social Care.



**Baroness Hollins** leads the Independent Care (Education) and Treatment Review Oversight Panel - a group looking into the care of people being kept in long term segregation.

#### Dear Baroness Hollins,











A **review** means looking into something to see how well it is working.

Long term segregation is when you are kept away from other people in hospitals, care homes and mental health units.

A **mental health unit** is where people stay for treatment for their mental health condition.

I am worried about the number of people who are being kept in long term segregation.

We want to make sure that things change for people with a learning disability and autistic people.



### What the government will do

I am going to do the important things that you said should be done straight away. I am going to:

#### 1. Set up a new job called a 'senior intervenor'



The **senior intervenor** is somebody who will help to improve things for people in segregation. They will work to:

reduce the amount of time people are kept in long term segregation



 move people to live in their local community



 move people to a safe place where they can mix with other people.



The senior intervenor will do this by:

giving more support to the managers of services



 making sure there are ways to move people out of long term segregation



 making sure that people have proper plans for how they want to be cared for, and how they want to live



making sure that everyone does their job in the right way.



## 2. Do regular reviews

You suggested that there should be regular reviews of people in long term segregation. I agree.



I have asked for a report on the best way to do this.

3. Continue the Independent Care (Education) and Treatment Review Oversight Panel

I am going to ask you to continue your work with the Independent Care (Education) and Treatment Review Oversight Panel.
