The aircraft was parked beside Terminal 3on Stand H7 with just the crew on board preparing for flight when a servicing vehicle reversed into position by the forward to iletservice valve. The vehicle stopped about one foot from the aircraftbefore the driver leaned forward to start the drain pumps. Ashe did so the vehicle rolled backwards and into the aircraft. According to the police investigator, the servicing vehicle'shandbrake had not been applied.

The aircraft had to be withdrawn from service for repairs to the pressure hull which was punctured and dentedover an area of approximately 12 inches by 9 inches.
