After lift-off of the airship the pilot initiated a shallow climb, followed by a right-hand turn, with the intention of staying at low level within the boundary of the launch site field. During the climb left rudder was applied to maintain the desired track, but the airship did not respond and continued in a right-hand turn towards the downwind boundary of the field. The pilot became aware that the airship was on a collision course with some large trees and, as the rudder appeared to be ineffective and there was insufficient space available in which to land safely, decided to climb in an attempt to avoid the obstacle. Despite the use of the double burner the airship struck a large branch and came to rest approximately 75 to 80 feet above the ground.

The pilot assessed that the cause of the accident was due to a steering failure, but due to the damage sustained by the airship during the subsequent recovery it was not possible to carry out a meaningful examination of the rudder system.
