Following landing at Birmingham Airport, after a positioning flightfrom East Midlands Airport, it was found that an access panelhad detached from the No.1 engine pylon. Associated minor damagewas found on the leading edge of the left tailplane. The aircraft'screw had not been aware of any problem until the missing panelwas noticed after arrival at Birmingham. The associated accesspanel was not recovered, but its detachment was reported to havebeen attributed to lack of proper securement.
