The aircraft was taxiing to park after landing on Runway 26; being a tailwheel aircraft it was taxied in a zigzag manner. The pilot noticed a pile of bricks and sand on the taxiway edge to his right. Shortly after he had turned left away from this, the aircraft stopped suddenly and tilted about 45° nose down; the propeller struck the ground. The left main gear had dropped into a hole at the side of the taxiway. The pilot shutdown the aircraft and vacated it without injury.

The airfield operator reported that the excavation at the side of the taxiway had been made to check the flow in a drain. Small yellow cones, of the type normally placed along a roadside to indicate a temporary no waiting area, marked it. The hole should have been converted into an inspection chamber some time prior to the day of the accident, but the work had not been completed.

Whilst the markers were conspicuous under normal circumstances, the limited forward visibility from a taxiing tailwheel aircraft and the pilot's preoccupation with avoiding other hazards on or near the taxiway were factors in him not noticing them.
