The aircraft had undergone extensive work on its engine and was preparing to take-off for a Certificate of Airworthiness renewal test flight. Following considerable ground running and power checks it took off and climbed normally towards rising ground. At about 150 feet agl there was a sudden and complete power loss. The pilot turned the aircraft through 90° to the right to land in a field of winter corn but had insufficient height and airspeed to clear a substantial boundary hedge which was contacted apparently by the left landing gear. Although the aircraft landed in a 3-point attitude, the left landing gear collapsed, tipping the aircraft onto its left wingtip, nose and right wingtip in turn before settling back into an upright attitude.

The reason for the power loss is being investigated but it is known that there appears to be no major mechanical failure of the engine. The possibility that water contamination or some blockage manifested itself as the aircraft adopted a flying attitude is also being pursued.
