The pilot was making an approach to Runway 26 at Priors Byne Farm, Partridge Green, West Sussex. The runway has a grass surface and is 640 metres in length. Crossing the runway approximately 70 metres from the 26 threshold are 2 (11kV) power cables 8 metres and 10 metres high respectively. The weather at the time was fine with good visibility and a surface wind of 180° to 190°/10 to 15 kt.

The pilot reported that, although he had allowed sufficient height on his approach to clear the obstructions, a sudden and unexpected wind shear caused the aircraft to sink and strike the cables. As it did so the propeller stopped and the aircraft rolled rapidly to the left. The pilot corrected for the roll but, due to the drag effect of the cables and the sudden loss of power, he was unable to prevent the aircraft impacting heavily on the nose and right main landing gear. The aircraft came to a halt some 200 metres from the cables where the pilot and passenger were able to vacate the aircraft uninjured via the normal exit.
