The pilot had returned to Popham Airfield after a local flight. Runway 03 was in use. This runway is 900 metres in length with a grass surface and the approach is over trees that are notified as being up to 50 feet high. The surface wind was $360^{\circ}/05$ kt and the meteorological conditions were CAVOK. The circuit was busy and the pilot was operating without a radio. Microlight aircraft were flying a tight visual circuit with heavier traffic flying a normal pattern with a long straight-in approach. The pilot made two attempts to land without success, on the third approach he was established on finals behind other aircraft. Whilst sideslipping to the left, in order to touchdown at the runway threshold, the aircraft struck the top of a tree. The pilot completed a normal landing and was uninjured.

The pilot reported that when sideslipping this aircraft to the left the forward field of view was obscured.
