The aircraft, which had departed Coventry at approximately 1030 hrs, arrived overhead Sandown Airstrip and carried out a normal circuit and approach to Runway 05. The final stages of the approach were flown with full flap selected and at a speed of 65 kt. Touchdown on the uneven dry grass runway was carried out approximately 25 metres beyond the runway designation numbers. The pilot reported that although the attitude appeared normal in the flare, the aircraft bounced and, on second contact with the runway, the nose landing gear collapsed. The aircraft came to rest after a ground slide of some 50 metres. The pilot reported that the visual effects of the down sloping runway affected his assessment of when to flare the aircraft.

A witness in the control tower has stated that the pilot appeared to check forward just before his initial touchdown, landing nosewheel first.

The weather at the time was good with scattered cloud at 3,500 feet and a surface wind of 330°/10 kt.
