This was the student pilot's second solo detail of the day. Runway 23 has a grass surface that was dry and in good condition; the surface wind was 230°/6 kt. The aircraft bounced on landing and the pilot lowered the nose in order to see the runway better. He failed to adjust the attitude and the aircraft landed heavily on the nose landing gear. It came rapidly to a halt on the runway, and the pilot, who was wearing lap and diagonal upper torso restraint, escaped without injury.
