The pilot, who had used the airstrip many times, made an approach from the south over some trees to land in a northerly direction. The wind was 350°/13 kt and the 800 metre grass surface of the strip was wet.

Expecting a little windshear effect from the trees, the pilot chose to touch down at 70 kt, with 30° of flap and the throttle closed. When the aircraft landed, the brakes immediately locked and the aircraft skidded along the strip, with retardation provided only by the wet surface and a slight up gradient. Despite an unsuccessful attempt to use aerodynamic braking and to induce a ground loop, the aircraft struck a deer fence at the far end of the strip, whilst travelling at a fast walking pace.

The attempted ground manoeuvres had caused the aircraft to slew to the right and it contacted the fence with the left wing and the propeller.
