Following a normal start-up, the aircraft was taxied to the holding point for runway 27 and parked on a heading of about 250° with the handbrake on. The wind had been reported by ATC to the pilot as 270°/18 kt gusting 40 kt.

Very shortly after parking, and with the engine at idle rpm, the pilot felt the aircraft move to the left and, almost immediately, the tail rose and the aircraft tipped up onto its nose and port wingtip. He declared an Emergency on the radio and shut down the aircraft systems. About 15 seconds later the aircraft tipped completely over onto its back, rotating anticlockwise in the process and coming to rest pointing northwards.

There was no fire. The Emergency Services had been alerted by the ATCO and were already in attendance by the time the two occupants escaped, uninjured, via the starboard door.
