After landing at Heathrow Airport the aircraft was directed toStand G12 and brought to a halt in the required position. As theairbridge was being manoeuvred to the front left door of the aircraftit struck the left wing root and punctured the skin. The aircraftwas checked at a maintenance facility; the damage was assessed minor and the small puncture was repaired with speedtape. Investigation revealed that none of the airbridges at Heathroware compatable with the TU 154 and the local procedures have nowbeen re-written to ensure that this aircraft type is no longerparked on stands equipped with an airbridge.
