After an overflight to reconnoitre the area, the helicopter descended to a nominal 200 feet agl to film along a valley, the steep sides of which were heavily wooded. The helicopter's track was westerly and the speed was 60 kt. The surface wind was 240°/15 kt and the visibility was in excess of 10 km.

After about 1 minute of filming, the helicopter was banked to the left to avoid overflying a house but, during this manoeuvre, the front of the left skid struck and severed a small power cable. A precautionary landing was made in order to inspect for damage and this was subsequently carried out by engineering personnel normally responsible for the helicopter. It was cleared for a single flight back to its base, where a more detailed inspection and repair were carried out. The cable was of the usual two-wire type which customarily supplies domestic properties and the pilot reported that it did not have any high visibility attachments. Also, the supporting poles were in the wooded area and were not clearly visible from the air.
