Having completed the engine start, the commander signalled for the ground power unit to be removed from the aircraft. The crew then obtained the departure clearance and prepared to taxi to the runway. As no obstacles could be seen from the flight deck and as no ground crew were in sight, the brakes were released and the aircraft commenced taxiing. The ground engineer was handling this departure on his own, therefore it took him some time to stow the power-cable once he had been cleared to remove the ground power unit. Just as he commenced driving away, the aircraft started to move and immediately collided with the ground power unit. The company checklists have now been changed to incorporate a positive acknowledgement from the ground crew that the area is clear prior to commencing to taxi.
