The aircraft was on final approach to land on Runway 36 at Clacton; this runway has a grass surface, which was dry, and has an available landing distance of 542 metres. The weather was good with a surfacewind of 050°/10 to 15 kt. During the landing the student, who was the handling pilot, flared too high and the indicatedairspeed rapidly diminished. The instructor took control, appliedpower and lowered the nose but a gust of wind lifted the rightwing and the aircraft landed heavily on the left wheel. The leftwheel strut snapped just inboard of the wheel which broke awayand struck the flap and then broke the rear cabin window. Theaircraft came to a halt about 100 metres from the touchdown pointand just off the left side of the runway. The engine was shutdown and the 2 crew members and the passenger vacated the aircraftvia the side doors: the emergency vehicle arrived about 30 secondslater.

In his report of the incident the instructor accepted that heshould have taken control earlier but believed that he would stillhave landed safely had it not been for the wind gust.
