At the conclusion of a short local flight, the pilot experiencedconsiderable turbulence whilst flying the circuit pattern. Arrivingat the threshold of Runway 31, the aircraft ballooned and landedheavily, damaging the nosewheel and steering mechanism. The surfacewind was reported as 320°/9 Kt with isolated cumulonimbusat 2,000 feet. The pilot attributed the heavy landing to windshear and turbulence associated with an approaching thunderstorm.
