

Domperidone only available on prescription September 2014

Key messages

- You can no longer buy domperidone without a prescription.
- There is a small risk that domperidone may cause heart problems in some people. Your doctor can tell you if domperidone is suitable for you.
- If you have recently bought domperidone without a prescription and you wish to continue taking it, speak to your doctor or pharmacist at your next routine visit. There is no problem if you wish to stop and a healthcare professional can advise on suitable alternatives for nausea and vomiting.
- If you have been prescribed domperidone, there is no need to stop taking your medicine.
- Talk to a doctor straight away if you experience dizziness; fainting; chest pain; or a rapid, fluttering, or pounding heartbeat while taking domperidone.





What is domperidone and what does it do?

Domperidone is a medicine to stop you feeling sick (nausea) or being sick (vomiting). The brand name of domperidone is Motilium.

Why can I no longer buy domperidone without a prescription?

As with any medicine, domperidone may cause side effects in some people. It can cause irregular heartbeats (heart arrhythmia) and may slightly increase the risk of death due to heart problems. These are serious side effects but the chance that they may happen is very low. This risk may be slightly higher in some people, especially those who are older than 60 years and those who take more than 30 milligrams of domperidone a day (for more information, see article published in May

The benefits of domperidone still outweigh the risk of these side effects for some people. However, a doctor will review your medical history and information about the other medicines you are taking and consider the need for any tests to decide whether domperidone is suitable for you. For this reason, you can no longer buy domperidone without a prescription.

What should I do if I've bought domperidone without a prescription? If you have recently bought domperidone without a prescription and wish to continue taking it, speak to your doctor or pharmacist at your next routine visit. There is no problem if you wish to stop and your doctor or pharmacist can advise on suitable alternatives for nausea and vomiting

What should I do if I've been prescribed domperidone?

If you have been prescribed domperidone, there is no need to stop taking your medicine. Continue to take it as instructed by your doctor or nurse.

Speak to your doctor or pharmacist at your next routine visit if you have any problems with your heart, are taking medicines that affect your heart, or have liver problems. They may recommend an alternative treatment if needed.

What should I do if I think I'm having a side effect?

Whether you have bought domperidone with or without a prescription, talk to your doctor straight away if you have any of the following symptoms while taking domperidone:

- chest pain
- · shortness of breath
- rapid, fluttering, or pounding heartbeat
- dizziness
- extreme tiredness
- fainting
