

PART 1: TRANSPORT SERVICES & AFCAP



Transport Services Research (1)

- One of AFCAP's objectives is to promote *Transport Services* in rural areas
- Majority of existing research projects are on provision and maintenance of low volume road infrastructure
- Request for more research in Transport Services
- I.T. Transport has been sub-contracted as advisors on *Transport Services*



PART 2: WHAT HAS BEEN DONE SO FAR?



What has been done so far? (1)

- Stakeholder communication (incl. two country visits in October 2010 Kenya and Malawi)
- <u>Purpose:</u> To identify potential transport services project opportunities, which potentially can be included in the AFCAP programme



What has been done so far? (2)

Result/Outcome:

- Insight to current transport service related problems in the two countries (e.g. low demand; boda-boda)
- Few concrete transport research projects identified
- Focus on physical infrastructure and road maintenance
- Transport services is a private sector issue?



What has been done so far? (3)

Conclusion:

- Potential research ideas exist
- More follow up work is needed to identify <u>concrete</u> and <u>specific</u> research project ideas that can be included under the AFCAP programme
- Need to "throw the net wider" (mix of stakeholders)



PART 3: WHAT IS BEING DONE NOW?



What is being done now? (1)

- AFCAP invites Project Concept Notes (PCNs) for research projects on Rural Transport Services in sub-Saharan Africa
- Open to: Individuals, NGOs, firms, universities and similar organisations with relevant research and consultancy capability
- Projects must be located in Sub-Saharan Africa
- Project duration: 2 to 24 months



What is being done now? (2)

- Essential that the PNCs meet the following criteria as a minimum:
- A) Relevance to AFCAP's overall goal of providing reliable access for poor communities in Africa;
- B) Contribution to adding to existing knowledge and research in the area of *Rural Transport Services in sub-Saharan Africa*;
- C) Compliance with AFCAP's **4-way test** for project proposals.



Application Process

Two-step process:

- a) 1-page application form (https://www.AFCAP.org)
- b) Short proposal

Selection Process (1)

- Closing date for receipt of PCNs: 10th December 2010
- Initial evaluation of the PCNs will be carried out in accordance with the evaluation criteria and weighting specified in the Application Form
- PCNs successfully passing this stage will be shortlisted for further consideration (7th January 2011)



Selection Process (2)

- Requested to submit a short Research Project
 Proposal (Submission deadline: 28th January 2011)
- A final selection of research projects eligible for AFCAP funding will be produced
- Contracts awarded: 14th February 2011
- Commencement of Research projects: Feb/Mar 2011



Evaluation Criteria

AFCAP 4-way test

- Does the project have strong local ownership?
- Does the project include mainly research, knowledge dissemination or training?
- Will the project contribute to sustainable improvements in rural transport?
- Will the project contribute to building national or regional capacity?
