- 1. They are adults.
- 2. They usually have profession, social responsibilities and status, family etc.
- 3. They have real-life experiences

What do they want when they are learning?

- 1. An immediate success (*they can successfully solve their problems*)
- 2. To apply their experiences in the learning process.
- 3. To prefer self-pace learning (*learning by their experiences, entry level, time available*).

What they do NOT want?

- 1. Risks (the learned knowledge and skills can not be applied).
- 2. Theoretical subjects
- 3. learning in affected environment

2. Adult learning (training for adults)

Read the following questions and answers and identify the main differences between adult learning and children learning.

What are the differences?



The adult learning is learning and teaching activities oriented to solving (learning) problems of the adults.



The children learning is learning and teaching activities aimed at general

education for children.

What are the main features of the adult learning/training?

- Aimed at problem solving
- Master/skills-oriented (for adults)
- Focused on small group and/or individual leaning
- With integration between theories-practices and content-methods
- Suitable for self-learning
- Application of self-assessment of learning achievements.
