Introduction

- Poultry industry is one of the fastest growing segment of the agric sub-sector in Nigeria
- Accounts for 9-10% of the agricultural GDP with net worth value of over 250 million USD
- Poultry population is 140 million sub-divided into Commercial (25%), Semi-Commercial (15%) and Rural/Backyard (60%) FLD, 2007
- Structure of the industry vary from region to region
 - Small scale producers account for the bulk of production
 - Large scale for large share of the output in some regions

Classification of poultry production in Nigeria

- Two distinct poultry production systems are Commercial and Rural systems based on features such as scale, husbandry and productivity
- Major classifications based on:
 - Housing scale
 - Biosecurity level
- Housing scale classification
 - Intensive, Semi-Intensive and extensive (Kitalyi, 1998)
 - Commercial, Semi-Commercial, Backyard (Semi-Intensive) and Village Free range (Backyard extensive) – UNDP, 2006
- Biosecurity level classification
 - Sector 1 (Industrial Commercial Farms), Sector 2 (Large Commercial Farms), Sector 3 (Small Commercial Farms) and Sector 4 (Village or backyard production) - FAO

Structure of Commercial Poultry Production system

- Industrial Integrated sector (Sector 1)
 - Occupies apex position
 - Foundation stock for entire commercial poultry: Grand Parent Stock (GPS) and Parent Stock (PS)
 - High biosecurity level
 - Vertically Integrated and few in Nigeria
- Commercial Sectors 2 and 3
 - Represents non-foundation poultry stock
 - Serve as satellites of sector 1 companies for marketing products and surpluses
 - Sector 2 has medium biosecurity level while sector 3 has minimal or none
 - Sectors porduce either eggs or broilers or both
 - Majority of sector 2 farms are located in the South West of Nigeria

Structure of Backyard and Rural Poultry Production system

- Mostly rural based poultry and subsistent in nature
- Consists of low input low output with small flock size
- Birds are mostly not confined especially during the daytime when they scavenge
- May include some family poultry consisting minicommercial mixed stocks with some inputs into feeding and housing
- Poultry species in this category occupy a very important position in terms of socio-economics and also serve as source of protein for majority of rural dwellers

Important Key questions

- How do we clearly define the structure of the poultry industry in Nigeria?
- How do we address overlapping definitions
- Which system of classification do we adopt?

Conclusions

- There is an urgent need for extensive poultry mapping in Nigeria
- Definitions and classification of poultry production systems and structure in Nigeria needs to be standardized
