

# Literature review: Health policy analysis in Lower& Middle Income or Transitional Countries (LMIC/TC)

Full set of articles drawing on identified notions of policy analysis

#### Introduction

CREHS is a consortium of research groups which have come together in a collaborative research programme funded by the UK Government Department for International Development (DFID). The aim of the Consortium is to increase substantially what we know about how to strengthen health system policies and interventions in ways that preferentially benefit the poorest. It also aims to strengthen the capacity of partners to support local and global policy development through relevant, high quality, timely and well communicated research. New knowledge will be generated by combining the analytical frameworks of economics and policy analysis, in order to help countries address not only the design of policies but also their effective implementation. New insights into the policies, and implementation approaches that are likely to be effective in different contexts, will be derived through cross-country comparative analysis.

# Review of published health policy analysis papers

To support our work, CREHS has undertaken a systematic review of published literature from low and middle income, and transitional countries (LMIC/TC), that applies policy analysis frameworks and perspectives in examining health policy and experiences of health policy development and implementation. Policy analysis is an area of work widely applied outside the health sector in investigating the actors and forces influencing how policies are understood, developed, implemented, and re-formulated in practice. It is rooted in the understanding that policy change always involves contestation and the exercise of power, and that policy is socially constructed. However, the dominant focus of policy-related analysis in the health sectors of LMIC/TCs has been largely technical, considering which policies and interventions can most effectively address which health and health system problems. Yet many policies and interventions do not achieve their goals or have unintended and unwanted consequences. Since the mid 1990s there have, therefore, been calls for work that applies policy analysis frameworks to understand better the political nature of the processes of policy development and implementation in LMIC/TCs.

The systematic review that CREHS has undertaken seeks to take stock of the work that has been conducted in this field over the last decade or so, and to provide a basis for future CREHS research. Overall, it seeks to describe:

- the range of LMIC/TC health literature investigating processes of policy change and that draw on the understanding that policy is both politically contested and socially constructed;
- the insights this work provides for understanding the processes of policy change;
- the gaps in existing work, relevant to main bodies of relevant theory;
- the methodological challenges, strengths and weaknesses of this body of work.

## **Search strategy**

A systematic approach applied explicit procedures and reflective processes in identifying and reviewing published articles. Formal searches were conducted in October 2005 via two electronic databases (IBSS/BIDS and PubMED).

Key words used in the search included health AND policy AND implementation (PubMED), "policy analysis " AND health, health AND policy AND implementation, health AND policy AND Africa etc, health AND policy AND discourse, health AND policy AND power, health AND policy AND interests, health advocacy, health AND construct\* (BIDS)

Articles not addressing experience in LMIC/TCs were excluded. Judgments about whether the article primarily applied notions relevant to the policy analysis focus of this work were made, and cross-checked between two analysts. Where the dominant focus was identified as primarily on policy content or design, or did not explore policy change in depth, the article was excluded.

<u>Inclusion criteria:</u> In English; published 1994-2005; health& LMIC/TC; abstract/full paper accessible; drawing on identified notions of policy analysis; dominant focus on actors& processes.

<u>Exclusion criteria:</u> Not in English; not health and/or high income country; abstract not accessible; did not explore policy change in depth; dominant focus on content& design issues

#### This document

In this document we present an early product of the review – a full listing of the 322 published articles identified through systematic and comprehensive search strategies as most relevant to health policy analysis. It is being made available to other researchers to support their work in this field.

### **Next steps in this body of work**

A further set of richer, empirical investigations relevant to national settings has been taken forward for inclusion in an analytical review (see review categories below). A descriptive overview of the articles on this table will be prepared, as well as an analytical review of the richer empirical articles. Insights into the processes of policy change in LMIC/TC health sectors, gaps in existing work, and methodological issues will be discussed.

article has a particular strength of focus, this was also identified (\*see

below, with codes).

Methods: where possible, the study design/type of article, and the tools by which

data were gathered.

Review category: into which each article was placed for the analytical review. Group 4

articles were not included in further analysis.

## Review categories:

Articles in categories 1, 2& 3 were included because they had relevant empirical experience, were rich and methodologically authoritative, and the full paper was available. These were taken forward for inclusion into the analytical review.

Category 1: empirical examinations of (or reviews of experience with) policy change

Category 2: empirical studies of (or reviews of experience with) efforts to impact on policy

development or implementation ie. empirical advocacy or research-to-policy

Category 3: relevant to understanding of policy change, without addressing an empirical

example of a specific policy change. These were based on one or more constructs underlying the policy process, such as policy is socially

constructed, or actors are influenced by social norms.

Category 4: included in the full set for descriptive review (this table) but not taken forward

for inclusion in the analytical review for a range of reasons including: the full paper was not available; methodological weakness, raising concerns about the reliability of conclusions; insufficiently substantial analysis to add to our understanding of processes; less deep empirical analyses, without application to a country or sub-national context; relevant but more conceptual or overview

pieces with a predominantly international or theoretical focus

However, the nature of some articles meant that they needed to be coded differently. So for articles in *category 3* and some articles in *category 4*, the following themes and codes were used:

influence their behaviour, and hence implementation success of interventions. The socially constructed knowledge or attitudes of donors/planners/providers may not be culturally

relevant to beneficiaries/clients.

acceptability of interventions and actors' behaviour, hence
