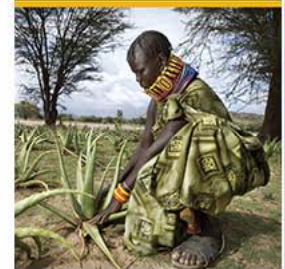

DFID's Research Strategy on Sustainable Agriculture

The livelihoods of 75% of the world's poor will continue to depend on agriculture for the foreseeable future. At the same time, rising food prices are likely to make problems of hunger and poverty worse for urban and rural people. Research that produces innovation in agriculture is therefore more important than ever for reducing poverty. DFID has promised to double funding for research on agriculture, fisheries and forestry to £80 million a year by 2010. To meet that promise, DFID will continue to work on the research priorities in the 2006 Strategy for Research on Sustainable Agriculture. It will also focus on key emerging issues related to agriculture and natural resource management that fit its broader agenda of inclusive growth and climate change. A Working Paper on Sustainable Agriculture provides more details of the approach to sustainable agriculture and the consultation process which helped to inform the Research Strategy.

Citizenship DRC Participatory Video Project

Researchers at the DFID-funded Citizenship DRC are using simple video cameras as innovative research and communication tools to reach new audiences. The videos that are produced are providing a way for research participants to articulate their views and get their message heard, promoting debate with policy makers, community-based groups and NGOs. It has already been shown that participatory video can be a powerful communication tool for people to use to get their ideas and experiences to politicians and the media, groups which they would not be able to reach otherwise.

Training in participatory video for researchers from Brazil, Bangladesh, Mexico, Jamaica, Nigeria, Angola and the UK in 2006 was put in action in 2007 as researchers started to use video as part of their research and to tell people about their activities. They also trained others in their own countries in participatory video, often to great effect:

- Juana Wheeler trained 15 community researchers from favelas or urban slums in Rio de Janeiro while she was researching citizenship in violent areas in Brazil. First using video to conduct conversations around the research questions with community-based researchers, she went on to work with the same community researchers making videos on subjects that were important to them. The community researchers went on to organise a popular public screening and debate around the subject matter which drew in city legislators, the ministry of culture and community leaders, and the next day the screening and debate attracted the attention of the national media.
- In Bangladesh, Semeen Mahmud and colleagues are looking at the role of civil society movements in improving democracy, citizenship and participation in society. Working with the Grameen Bank, research participants learned how to use the equipment with little difficulty and conducted interviews, exploring issues including local problems, price rises and current affairs and politics. After carrying out the recordings, community members realised that video could be a powerful way to promote debate and empower the community.
- Idaci Ferreira is training other NGOs and community level development workers in Angola to use participatory video in research and other development projects. She describes using video, and especially the way stories can be told and videos edited with the community message in mind as "an amazing experience... It was amazing that people spent a lot of time choosing what they wanted to put in the film... [there was] a lot of debate." Steve Abrah from the Theatre for Development Centre in Nigeria believes the process has been a learning experience for both researcher and research participants: "community members and the organisations you are working with... decide what the story is and who should be recording the stories... it is not us going there and saying this is a new tool and this is how you use it."

This Knowledge Programme has made a substantial contribution to pro-poor malaria research in the areas of:

- Identification of factors that contribute to vulnerability and mechanisms for improving resilience to the effects of malaria.
- Providing evidence about significant wastage of resources through inappropriate malaria diagnostic strategies and poor quality laboratory services and promoting policies and practices to improve resource utilisation.
- Building local ownership of research projects and strengthening capacity to generate and utilise research to address important local issues.

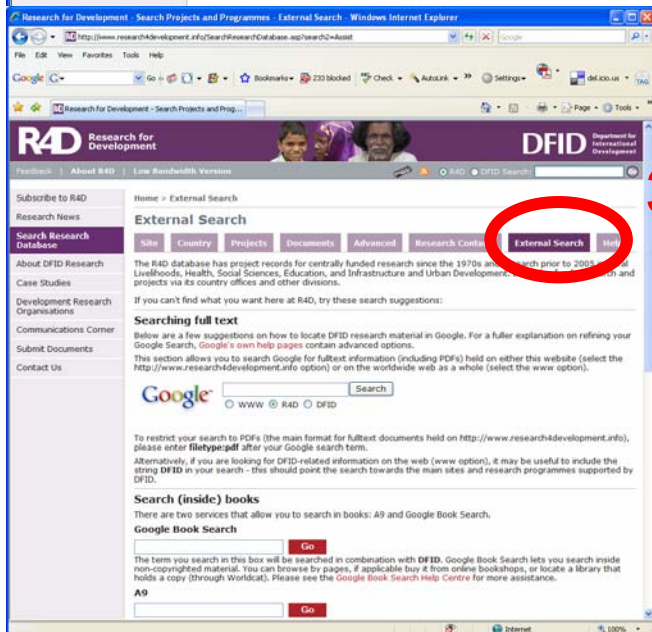
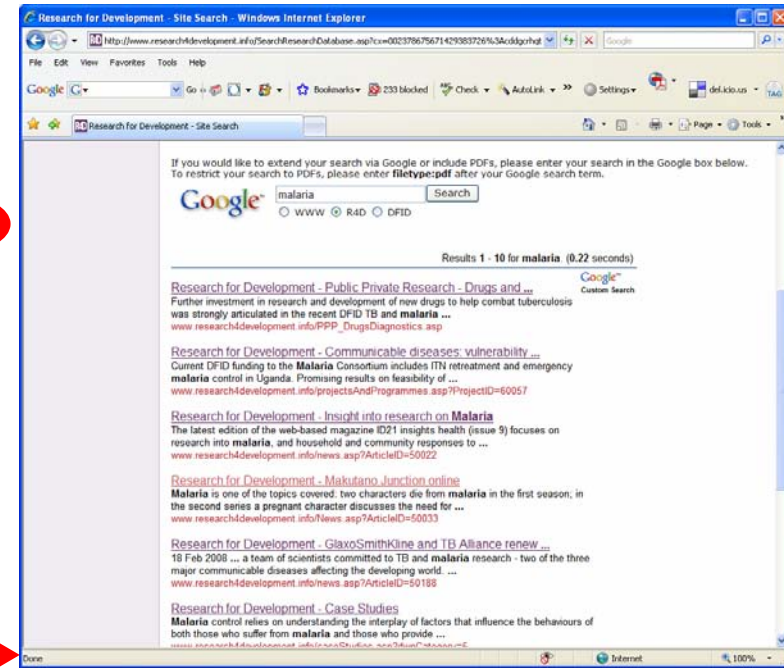
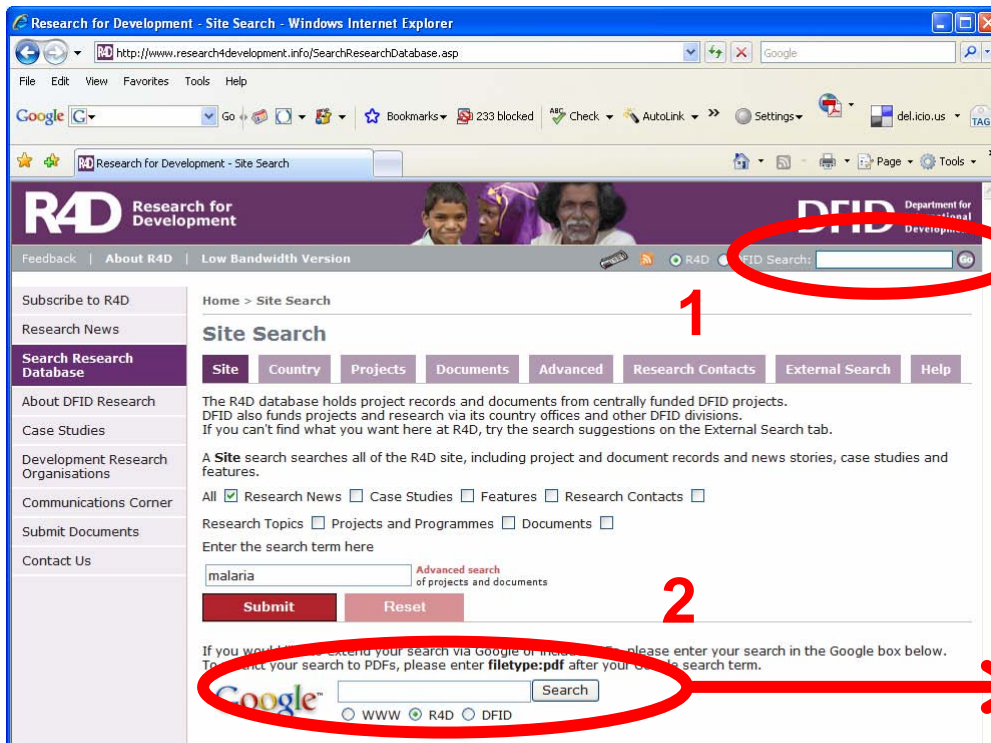
By establishing a multi-disciplinary Vulnerability and Health Alliance, the Malaria Knowledge Programme has applied novel and synergistic perspective to issues of vulnerability to malaria. A major outcome from this initiative is a framework for conceptualising the breadth of influences on vulnerability. This framework can be applied to all major infectious diseases and is particularly useful for identifying gaps in knowledge and priorities for improving resilience that will impact across malaria, TB and HIV. The framework has been used to guide research and practice and related research has been scaled up to national level, for example in Ghana where a gender unit has been established in the Policy and Planning Directorate. The Programme has identified urban residents as being particularly vulnerable to malaria; compared to malaria in rural locations, this is a significantly under recognised but rapidly increasing problem. The Knowledge Programme has organised an international consultation on urban malaria to develop a consensus statement for urban malaria control. The statement highlights key priorities for controlling urban malaria such as harmonising cross-sectoral collaborations and elucidating transmission mechanisms.

Through the Knowledge Programme, LSTM has been established as an international expertise base in making laboratory systems work for the poorest. Major problems in the diagnosis of malaria have been demonstrated at all levels in poor countries. There is inadequate support for laboratories which remain neglected despite the critical role they play in malaria management. Laboratory issues are poorly understood and appreciated by local, national and international policy makers. In collaboration with policy makers, the Knowledge Programme has improved the quality of primary care diagnosis (e.g. by refining algorithms and using novel care providers such as literacy workers and school teachers) and established and evaluated model quality-assured laboratory systems which have been scaled up nationally and adapted for use in other countries. For example the Malaria Knowledge Programme has been instrumental in assisting Malawi to implement a national Essential Medical Laboratory Services policy and in supporting WHO to produce guidelines for research into low-tec diagnostics for anaemia.

All Programme research is initiated and owned by local partners and builds on existing mechanisms; these are key principles for ensuring that our research is relevant

RSS Hints and Tips

- News or RSS Feeds are an easy way to keep up to date with information being added to R4D.
- Instead of browsing through R4D to see whether any new project information has been added in a particular topic area, the feed will alert you about any new information relating to the chosen subject.
- The feed reader will display item information and a direct link to the appropriate web page.
- To make use of RSS Feeds you need a Feed Reader. The latest versions of internet browsers (Internet Explorer, Firefox and Safari) have built-in readers (implemented like bookmarks or favourites) which means that you do not necessarily need to install a separate Feed Reader.
- However, if you use RSS Feeds a lot, you may prefer to have a standalone Feed Reader running on your computer which is set to highlight new information. For example, the free NetNewsWire Lite for Macs or FeedReader for Windows.
- Once the Feed Reader is installed on your computer, select the relevant feed information in the R4D Feed Search, copy the url in the address field of the browser and paste it into the "Add" field of the Feed Reader.
