

IAVI Funding

IAVI's first donor was the foundation Until There's A Cure (UTAC), with a US\$200k grant over two years awarded in January 1996. On 4 September 1996 the Sloan Foundation awarded a US\$3m grant over 3 years. The Rockefeller Foundation Board approved funding of US\$2.5m over one year on 9 September 1996. Starting as a small organization with a limited budget, IAVI has mobilized more than US\$583m over the past decade to accelerate the search for an AIDS vaccine.

IAVI's financial and in-kind supporters include the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the Foundation for the National Institutes of Health, The John D.
