

Completed acquisition by Acadia Healthcare Company, Inc. of Priory Group No. 1 Limited

Notice under paragraph 2(4) of Schedule 10 to the Enterprise Act 2002 – consultation on modifications to proposed undertakings in lieu of reference pursuant to section 73 of the Act

ME/6587/16

Introduction

 On 7 October 2016, the CMA issued a Notice of Consultation on the Proposed Undertakings to address the competition concerns identified in its SLC decision of 14 July 2016. The terms defined in the Notice of Consultation have the same meaning in this Notice.

The proposed modification

- 2. The CMA proposes to modify the Proposed Undertakings by adding the Priory *Brighton* site to the list of sites to be divested set out in the Annex to the Proposed Undertakings. The undertakings as modified are referred to as the **Modified Undertakings**. The full list of proposed sites to be divested are set out in Annex 1 to this notice. The details of the Priory *Brighton* site are set out in Annex 2 to this notice. The Priory *Brighton* site was one of the 22 sites listed for divestment in the Notice of Consultation of 7 October 2016, but was omitted from the text of the Proposed Undertakings.
- 3. The text of the Modified Undertakings has now been published on the case page, including details of the Priory *Brighton* divestment site.

Proposed decision and next steps

4. For the reasons set out in the Notice of Consultation of 7 October 2016, the CMA currently believes that the Modified Undertakings and the purchase of the Divestment Business by either of the Proposed Purchasers, in the circumstances of this case, is appropriate to remedy, mitigate or prevent the

- competition concerns identified in the SLC Decision and form as comprehensive a solution to these concerns as is reasonable and practicable.
- 5. The CMA therefore gives notice that it proposes to accept the Modified Undertakings in lieu of a reference of the Merger for a phase 2 investigation. The text of the Modified Undertakings is available on the CMA case page.¹
- 6. Before reaching a decision as to whether to accept the Modified Undertakings, the CMA invites interested parties to make their views known to it. The CMA will have regard to any representations made in response to this consultation and may make modifications to the Modified Undertakings as a result. If the CMA considers that any representation necessitates any material change to the Modified Undertakings, the CMA will give notice of the proposed modifications and publish a further consultation.²
