Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rule 21

1. The claimant was dismissed by reason of redundancy and is entitled to a redundancy payment of £7,185. (The claimant's date of birth is 13.1.76. He was dismissed on 25.7.16 with 15 years complete service. The statutory weekly cap of £479 applies.)
2. The respondent is ordered to pay costs to the claimant under rule 75(1)(b) in the sum of £160 in respect of the issue paid by the claimant in these proceedings

THE EMPLOYMENT TRIBUNALS (INTEREST) ORDER 1990

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties. That day is known as "*the relevant decision day*". The date from which interest starts to accrue is called "*the calculation day*" and is the day immediately following the relevant decision day.

The rate of interest payable is that specified in section 17 of the Judgments Act 1838 on the relevant decision day. This is known as "the stipulated rate of interest" and the rate applicable in your case is set out below.
