# BYE-LAWS

Made by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department under the provisions of the Military Lands Acts, 1892 to 1903, as among by Regulation 52 of the Defence Regulations, 1939, and by virtue of the Regulation, for regulating the use of the above-mentioned Range.

#### GENERAL PROHIBITION.

1. During such time as notice is given by the hoisting and display is signals in manner hereinafter provided that firing is taking place in the land and sea area hereinafter referred to as the Penhale Light Anti-Airmin Artillery Range, the limits of which are set out in the Schedule hereto intrusion on the land and sea area and all obstruction of the use thereof prohibited.

#### OFFENCES DURING FIRING.

- 2. While notice that firing is taking place in the areas mentioned a Bye-law No. 1 is given by the hoisting and display of signals as provided Bye-law No. 3, then in respect of the land and sea areas:—
  - (a) No person shall enter or remain within the land area or sea are nor bring, take or suffer to remain therein any vehicle, animal vessel, aircraft or thing except as provided in Bye-law No. 7
  - (b) No vessel shall be employed in fishing in the sea area.
  - (c) No pleasure boat shall cruise in any part of the sea area.
  - (d) No vessel shall anchor or remain anchored in or ground in the area.
  - (e) No aircraft shall alight one remain in, or travel upon the sea
  - (f) In the event of any vessel or aircraft being from any cause with the sea area, the Master or Pilot or other person in charge that shall use his utmost endeavours to pass out of the sea area with loss of time.

#### SIGNALS.

- 3. Notice that firing is taking place is given by the hoisting and denote the following signals:—
  - (a) In respect of the Sea Area:—

#### By Day.

- (i) A Red Flag not less than ten feet above a Black Ball six diameter on a flagstaff at PENHALE POINT.
- (ii) A Red Flag on a flagstaff at NEWQUAY COASTGUARD ES LISHMENT.

By Night.

- (iii) A Flashing Red Light, giving one flash every second from a flagstaff at PENHALE POINT.
- (iv) A Red Fixed Light on a flagstaff at NEWQUAY COASTGUARD ESTABLISHMENT.
- (b) In respect of the Land Area:-
- By Day.—A Red Flag on a flagstaff at the positions occupied by each of the four safety parties at the following points:—
  - (i) Northern Safety Party: on cliff edge above HOLYWELL BEACH 200 yards South-West of river mouth.
  - (ii) Southern Safety Party: on the beach half a mile North of CARN-HAUT.
- (iii) Eastern Safety Party: on the border of the land area at ST.
  PIRANS CHURCH.
- (iv) Camp Safety Party: on the road near the camp quarter of a mile South of HOBLYN'S COVE.
- (v) A Red Flag on a flagstaff with a "DANGER" notice board at the entrance to PENHALE ESTATE.
- By Night.—Two Red Fixed Lights arranged vertically, three feet apart, on a flagstaff at the positions occupied by each of the four safety parties at the following points:—
- (vi) Northern Safety Party: on cliff edge above HOLYWELL BEACH 200 yards South-West of river.
- (vii) Southern Safety Party: on beach half a mile North of CARNHAUT.
- (viii) Eastern Safety Party: on the borders of the land area at ST. PIRANS CHURCH.
  - (ix) Camp Safety Party: on the road near the camp quarter of a mile South of HOBLYN'S COVE.

#### DURATION OF SIGNALS.

The signals referred to in this Bye-law will be hoisted and displayed one before firing is due to commence and will remain hoisted and displayed at firing has ceased.

#### RECOVERY OF SHELL, ETC.

No person shall trawl, dredge or search for or otherwise interfere with shot, shell or other projectile or portions thereof within the land area he sea area or take or retain, or be in possession of any such shot, shell where projectile, or portions thereof, found within the land or sea area.

Any person who when trawling, dredging, or in any manner whatever, tome into possession of any such shot, shell or other projectile, or any son thereof, within the sea area, shall not retain it, but shall immediately it in its then condition, and without tampering with it, into the water.

#### OFFICERS AUTHORISED.

5. Any person doing anything prohibited by or otherwise contravenia any of the preceding Bye-laws Nos. 1, 2 or 4 shall be deemed to commit

offence against the Bye-law so contravened.

The persons hereby authorised to remove or take into custody without warrant any person committing an offence against Bye-laws Nos. 2 or 4 or to remove any vehicle, animal, vessel, aircraft or thing found in the land are or in the sea area in contravention of any of the said Bye-laws are:

(1) The Major-General in Charge of Administration, Southern Command

(2) The Officer in Charge of the Range.

- (3) Any Officer, Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer, or any Military Policeman, for the time being under the command of the said Officer in Charge.
- (4) Any person authorised in writing under the hand of the said Officer in Charge.
- (5) Any Constable.

# WHEN VESSEL OR AIRCRAFT IN DANGER.

6. While any vessel or aircraft is observed within the sea area a second red flag by day or an additional flashing red light by night will be hoisted at the flagstaff at PENHALE POINT below the Flag and Ball or Flashing Red Light referred to in Bye-law No. 3 (a) to notify the Master or Pilot or other person in charge of the vessel or aircraft that he is within such sea area Firing will then normally be continued outside the limit of twenty degree on either side of such vessel or aircraft.

#### EXEMPTIONS.

7. These Bye-laws shall not apply to :--

(a) Any vessel entering or passing through the sea area in the ordinate course of navigation.

(b) Any vessel compelled to enter or unable to quit the sea arce

reason of the exigencies of navigation.

(c) Any vessel employed in tending, placing or replacing any of the channel mark buoys or other aids to navigation within the area.

(d) H.M. Ships of War, H.M. Aircraft, or any vessel or aircraft employed under Admiralty or Air Council Authority.

(e) Any aircraft compelled to alight on or unable to quit the sea are

(f) Any vessel belonging to the Corporation of Trinity House, Lewis whilst employed on any Trinity House duty or service.

(g) Any foreign vessel or aircraft when outside territorial waters.

#### INTERPRETATION.

(a) "Vessel" in these Bye-laws includes ship, yacht, lighter, hoat and for every kind, and whether navigated by steam, motor, sail, oars, or betwise.

(b) "Aircraft" in these Bye-laws includes all balloons, whether fixed or-

mig machines.

## DATE OF OPERATION OF BYE-LAWS.

9. These Bye-laws shall come into force at the date hereof.

#### SCHEDULE.

## DESCRIPTION OF LAND AND SEA AREAS.

IN LAND AREA. The Land Area is bounded as follows :--

On the North-East and South.—By the river running in a South-Easterly sirection from Holywell Bay, from its mouth to the point where it is crossed by the footbridge on the road or lane leading to Trebisken, thence by a line running South-Westwards across Penhale Sands in a direction of 229° for a fistance of approximately 1.360 yards, thence by a line running in a direction \$255° to the High Water Mark, thence—

On the West and North.—By the line of High Water Mark to the starting soint.

( SEA AREA. The Sea Area is bounded as follows :--

On the North and West.—By the arc of a circle radius 7.40 nantical miles with its centre in Latitude 50° 23′ 12″ N., Longitude 5° 8′ 48″ W.

In the South.—By a line drawn from a point on High Water Mark in Latitude 50° 22′ 00° N., Longitude 5° 8′ 36" W. In a direction of 232° meet the above-mentioned arc.

On the East.—By the line of High Water Mark Northwards from the bove-mentioned point in Latitude 50° 22′ 00″ N., Longitude 5° 8′ 36″ W., to a point bearing 360° from the above centre, thence by a line drawn in a firection of 360° to meet the above-mentioned arc.

#### NOTICES.

#### PENALTY FOR OFFENCES.

(1) By Section 17 (2) of the Military Lands Act, 1892, it is provided

If any person commits an offence against any Byells under this Act he shall be liable on conviction before a Couri Summary Jurisdiction to a fine not exceeding FIVE POUND and may be removed by any Constable or Officer authorised manner provided by the Bye-law from the area, whether law or water, to which the Bye-law applies, and taken into custod without warrant, and brought before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law, and any vehicle animal, vessel or thing found in the area in contravention any Bye-law may be removed by any Constable or such Offices as aforesaid and on due proof of such contravention be declared by a Court of Summary Jurisdiction to be forfeited to His Majesty.

#### APPLICATION TO SEA AREA.

(2) By Section 2 (2) of the Military Lands Act, 1900, it is provided:

Where any land, the use of which can be regulated by Bye. laws under the Military Lands Act, 1892, or this Act, abuts on any sea or tidal water, or where rifle or artillery practice is at can be carried on over any sea, tidal water or shore from any such land, Bye-laws may be made in relation to any such sea, tidal water or shore as if they were part of the land.

## PROCEDURE FOR CLEARING SEA AREA.

(3)—(a) Vessels entering or remaining within the sea area in contravention of any of the preceding Bye-laws may under Section 17 (2) of the Military Lands Act, 1892 (see (1) above) be removed from the area. In such case any vessel acting under the orders of the local Military Authorities will, when necessary, tow the offending vessel out of the area.

(b) Masters of vessels entering or remaining within the sea area by reason of the exigencies of navigation and exempt from the operation of the Bye-law under Bye-law No. 7 (b) are requested to assist the carrying out of Artiller Practice by consenting to be towed out of the area, by any vessel acting under the Orders of the local Military, Naval or Royal Air Force Authorities

#### TIMES OF FIRING.

(4) Firing will take place on the range during any period throughout the year.

Except when night firing occurs, no firing will take place between thous of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. the following morning.

Night firing will not usually last after 2 a.m.

## PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF FIRING.

(5) As soon as firing has been completed each day a notification will sent by telephone to the Coast Guard Station at Newquay. If on any it is decided that no firing shall take place, a similar notification will be as soon as it is decided,

#### ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS DURING FIRING.

- (6) Safety parties will be stationed at the following points when the
  - (i) Northern Safety Party on cliff edge above HOLYWELL BEACH 200 yards South-West of river mouth.
  - (ii) Southern Safety Party on the beach half of a mile North of CARN-HAUT.
  - (iii) Eastern Safety Party on the border of the land area at ST. PIRANS CHURCH.
- (iv) Camp Safety Party on the road near the Camp quarter of a mile South of HOBLYN'S COVE.

# THERE BYE-LAWS CAN BE OBTAINED AND PLAN OF THE RANGE INSPECTED.

#### AIRCRAFT WARNING.

(8) Aircraft are warned not to fly in the vicinity of this range while firing in progress and no liability for accidents to aircraft arising from the use of the range can be admitted.

Notwithstanding any fine limit mentioned in the above byelaws the current maximum fine as at 01/09/2008 is the sum of £500 being the maximum on level 2 of the standard scale.
