## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000**

I refer to your correspondence of 7<sup>th</sup> October 2010 requesting information, which we have dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You asked for the number of Northern Ireland and Great Britain registered goods lorries that have been stopped in the last 3 years.

Please see spreadsheet attached to the corresponding email labeled "F0002926 GB and NON GB Encounters, Prohibitions and GFPD". This details the number of roadside encounters with N.I. and G.B. Heavy Goods Vehicle (HGV) operators in the last three financial years together with the number and rates of mechanical, driver hour and weighing prohibitions. This also lists the number of Graduated Fixed Penalty & Deposit (GFPD) Notices issued to GB, foreign and NI drivers from when the scheme was introduced, 29<sup>th</sup> May 2009 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2010.

Please note that the figures listed are for encounters with vehicles which are N.I. or G.B. based HGV operators not for N.I. or G.B. registered vehicles as originally requested as VOSA does not hold registered keeper details.

I have also attached two further spreadsheets detailing the value of GFPD notices issued to drivers by operator vehicle nationality between 28/05/2009 and 28/02/2010. This includes GFPD notices issued to NI operators.
