

1) Please can you email me the statistics for candidates passing their car theory test for January to December 2010.

The table must show the following:

- Jan – Dec
- The number of applications received
- The number of candidates who passed
- The percentage pass rate

You can find the number of applications received, the number of candidates who passed and the pass percentage rate in the table below. This information is for the car theory test and for the period January to December 2010.

We have also provided you with the number of car theory tests conducted over the same period.
