Please provide details of the budget for the FCO's 'Jubilee Programme' to cover the period from its inception (believed to be 2012) up to the current financial year.

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request.

The FCO Jubilee Programme was started in 2012 and the budget, per annum, is as follows:

2012/2013 £450,000 2013/2014 £480,000 2014/2015 £435,000

Responsibility for managing this funding is delegated to the Governor's offices in the Overseas Territories. There is no requirement for us to hold records in London as to how

each Territory spends this allocation. However, we do hold this incomplete list of projects that have been approved under the fund, which I hope will be of interest.
