The Able Marine Energy Park (AMEP) Development Consent Order (DCO) 2014 No. 2935: Notice of variation to Deemed Marine Licences under Schedule 8 of the order.

The Marine Management Organisation (MMO), as the Licensing Authority, has now completed its consideration of your requests dated 4 April 2017 and 10 May 2017 for a variation to the Deemed Marine Licence, under Section 72 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, of the AMEP DCO 2014. The variations requested administrative changes to the Deemed Marine Licence.

The MMO has varied the Deemed Marine Licence in accordance with the information received from Able.

If you wish to appeal then in accordance with rule 22(1)(b) of the Tribunal Procedure (First-tier Tribunal) (General Regulatory Chamber) Rules 2009 (SI 2009/1976) you have 28 days from the date of the sending of the notice of variation to send or deliver a notice of appeal to the First-tier Tribunal.
