Notifications of infectious diseases, some of which are later microbiologically confirmed, prompt local investigation and action to control the diseases. Proper officers are required every week to inform the PHE (formerly the Registrar General) anonymised details of each case of each disease that has been notified. PHE has responsibilty of collating the weekly returns from proper officers and publishing analyses of local and national trends.
