

NOTICE OF ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 SECTION 119

Cornwall Council
(Bridleway No. 11, Laneast (Part)) (Coombegate, Pipers Pool) Public Path
Diversion Order 2015

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **9 December 2015**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of exchanges of statements of case and comments on statements of case.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert a length of Public Bridleway number 11 Laneast commencing from a point where it has a junction with that part of Bridleway number 11 Laneast to be retained approximately 360 metres north-west of the property "Coombegate" at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SX 2454/8472 shown as Point "A" on the Order map thence running in a generally south-easterly and then southerly direction for a distance of 504 metres to a point where it has a junction with the northern margin of County Road A395 approximately 125 metres south of the property "Coombegate" at OSGR SX 2484/8433 shown as Point "B" on the Order map to a length of Public Bridleway commencing from a point where it has a junction with that part of Bridleway number 11 Laneast to be retained approximately 360 metres north-west of the property "Coombegate" at Ordnance Survey Reference (OSGR) SX 2454/8472 shown as Point "A" on the Order map thence running in a generally south-westerly then southerly then south-easterly then south-south-easterly then south-westerly direction for a distance of 350 metres to a point where it has a junction with the northern margin of County Road A395 approximately 360 metres west of the property "Coombegate" at OSGR SX 2445/8445 shown as Point "C" on the Order map.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and comments

Within 2 weeks of the start date [by 23 December 2015]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 3 February 2016]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation or any other written representation must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 16 March 2015]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation, the Authority, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who has written to us in respect of the Order must ensure that their comments on any or every other statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of these comments to everyone else.

Any other person wishing to make representations in writing to the Secretary of State in respect of the above Order must do so in line with the timetable set out above.

In fairness to the other parties everyone should keep to the timetable to ensure that statements of case and comments are received on time.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
