Further to reading the submissions objecting to and supporting these applications, I feel I have to write to point out a glaring inaccuracy in the letter of support ref: REP52

In this letter it is stated that '... farming is the major employer in this area...'

It may be that farming occupies the largest land area but figures show that Tourism and Agriculture (which includes forestry operations in the figures) are the top two providers of GDP into the Powys economy. The actual figures do show a small variation each year but the breakdown recently has been in the order of 12% for tourism and 11% for agriculture.

If the landscape is adulterated and destroyed by these wind farm monstrosities and the industrialisation of the landscape by the associated infrastructure, electricity pylons and cables, it would have more detrimental financial effect in the area from reduction in tourism and could lead to much more loss of employment and income.

With the weak pound, Britain is an attractive place for visitors both from abroad and home and it would be destructive both to the landscape and the economy to deter visitors from benefiting from this beautiful landscape because of this unwarranted destruction of our ancient historical landscape.
