





Animal Feed Statistics for Great Britain - March 2017

Key points

- Animal feed production was up 8.8% for sheep, 4.1% for poultry and 7.4% for cattle and calves and down 1.3% for pigs in March 2017 compared to March 2016.
- 4.9% more wheat was used to produce animal feed in March 2017 than March 2016 and 4.2% more barley.
- Over the crop year from July to March, animal feed production was up 17% for sheep, 3.6% for poultry and 1.5% for cattle and down 5.6% for pigs compared to the previous crop year.
- Over the crop year from July to March, wheat used to produce animal feed was up 5.1% and barley was down 4.5% compared to the previous crop year.

Usage of the Statistics

The UK government and the European Commission use these statistics to monitor and assess stocks of cereals as a key component of our food security. The estimates contribute to the UK cereal balance sheets published by the Agricultural and Horticultural Development Board AHDB. Animal feed processors and grain traders use the estimates to help assess market conditions and inform business decisions.

Revisions

We have reviewed some IPU's (Integrated Poultry Units) which produce both feed for their own use and feed for retail sale. We have adjusted the data from August 2015 which has resulted in an increase in compound poultry feed and a decrease in IPU feed. This statistical notice has been updated with final 2016 data for those smaller companies which are only surveyed annually.

Compound animal feed prices - key points

- The quarterly average price of Cattle and Calf compounds between January and March 2017 was £211 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Pig compounds between January and March 2017 was £231 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Poultry compounds between January and March 2017 was £246 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Sheep compounds between January and March 2017 was £213 per tonne
