Questions

The Taking Part Survey began in 2005/06 and has been running each year since. Whilst changes to the questions have been kept to a minimum to allow for comparisons over time to be made, some changes have been made due to new Government policies emerging or new stakeholder requirements for data. To keep the average adult interview time to 40 minutes, where new questions have been added others have been removed, shortened or asked less frequently.

Sample size

The sample size has varied each year depending on resources available. The sample size for each year since the survey began, including the latest year (2011/12) is given in the table below.
