Does the Scottish Parliament motion signal a change in UK policy towards recognising the Armenian massacres as genocide?

No. Under the terms of the devolution settlement foreign policy is a reserved policy matter and is the responsibility of the UK Government and UK Parliament. Whilst the Scottish Parliament is able to debate any matter that it wishes it does not have policy or legislative competence in this area and does not alter or signify a change to British Government policy.
