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DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 251 OF THE APPRENTICESHIPS, SKILLS, CHILDREN AND LEARNING ACT 2009

This Direction covers the form, content and publication of information about actual expenditure by all Local Authorities in England, in connection with their education functions and their children's social services functions, for the period 1st April 2013 – 31st March 2014

The Secretary of State for the Department for Education makes the following direction in exercise of the power conferred upon him by section 251 of the Apprenticeships, Skills, Children and Learning Act 2009:

That all Local Authorities ("LAs") in England prepare and submit a statement ("Outturn Statement") containing financial information about:

- how much the LA has spent on their schools budget, de-delegated items, high needs budget, early years budget, central provision within the schools budget and children and young people's services.

So that meaningful comparisons of the expenditure may be made among LAs, all Outturn Statements must be prepared in a common format.

LAs must submit their Outturn Statement for the 2013-14 period to the Department for Education via the Department's Centralised On-Line for Learning, Education, Children and Teachers (COLLECT) system, by 25th August 2014.

The Outturn Statement must be published and presented in two parts for the prescribed period. The tables should appear on the authority's website in the following order:

Table A – LA level information

Table A1 – Children's and Young People's Services

The LA's Outturn Statement must be made available as follows:

- to every school, including nursery schools, maintained by the authority: the authority must provide a hard copy of each outturn statement to the governing body and head teacher of each school maintained by them if in the unlikely event they do not have access to the Internet;

- to those private, voluntary and independent provides (PVI providers) who are funded to provide free early years provision to 3 and 4 year olds: the LA must show how they can access a copy of the outturn statement;
- to the general public: the authority must make a copy of the whole statement available at the education offices of the LA (where a copy must be available for inspection by parents and others in the community at all reasonable times and free of charge);
- on a website: the authority must make a copy of the whole statement available on a website which is maintained by the authority and accessible by the public.
