Business Rates Administration Review - Update

1. The Government published on 8 July an update on the action it is taking to improve the administration of business rates and a summary of responses to the interim findings. We are grateful for the support of practitioners in this work. The update sets out the progress the Government has made in developing a more efficient appeals system, better sharing of information, and

simpler billing and collection. The Government has committed to making these practical improvements to the business rates system by 2017. This update can be found at:
